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## Qurban Fundraiser

*Alhamdulillah* the blessed month of Dhu-al-Hijjah will be upon us soon. The month of hajj (pilgrimage) brings with it the festival of sacrifice (Qurban or Udhiya).

Eid ul-Adha is the celebration where Muslims everywhere remember the ultimate sacrifice that Prophet Ibrahim (AS) was prepared to make.

The celebration of Eid-ul-Adha is to commemorate Prophet Ibrahim's devotion to Allah (SWT) and his readiness to sacrifice his son, Ismail. At the very moment of submission, Allah (SWT) substituted a ram. This command from Allah (SWT) was a test of Prophet Ibrahim's willingness and commitment to obey his Lord's command, without question. Therefore, Eid-ul-Adha means the festival of sacrifice.

The School will hold a Qurban Fundraiser in week 10 of this term for the distribution of Qurban meat for the needy overseas. Students are requested to collect money for this worthy cause. We urge every student to collect as much as they can by **Friday 1st July**. Students must place the money collected in a sealed envelope with the student's name, class and amount clearly written on the front and hand it in at the Admin office on campus.

The Companions asked, "O Messenger of Allah! What is Udhiya?" He replied, 'It is the Sunnah of your father Ibrahim (peace be upon him).' They asked again, 'What benefit do we get from it?' He answered, 'A reward for every hair (of the sacrificed animal).' 'And [what reward is there for animals with] wool, O Messenger of Allah?' they asked. 'A reward', he said, 'for every fibre of the wool.'"
